Did you know that there is a heron rookery in Lund? Over a dozen of the birds are nesting above the old road that runs behind Scotch Place.

It's an easy walk to see them in their nests high in the trees. Simply follow the logging road that leads inland from the highway at Larson Road (across from the Community Centre), take your first left and, after about ten feet, start looking up.

You'll likely hear the herons before you see them and it's very uncanny - a bit like walking through Jurassic Park with all the funny clucking growling sounds. They get quite excited when an eagle happens by and they shriek loud enough to bring back any herons who are away feeding. Often they can be seen circling above their nests to try and protect them from predators.

But there are disadvantages too; the hassle of incorporating, then actually collecting the property taxes, keeping books, electing a town council, getting people to come to meetings, setting up committees, maybe getting people to agree on things, passing by-laws, and who knows what else.

Still, it's fodder for thought. It might be nice to have direct control over our own destiny, decide what we want and don't want to have happen here in Lund. Not that the Regional District is doing a bad job but Northside is a big area and they are occasionally spread thin.

But then sometimes it's nice to just pay our taxes and let someone else do all the administrative work.

Hmmmm.

Georgia Combes - 2007 Park Officer of the Year

Georgia Combes is a dedicated park ranger for Desolation Sound Provincial Park.

In her time as a park ranger, Georgia has been instrumental in initiating communication between the Sliammon First Nation and archaeological researchers in B.C. These initial communications became face-to-face meetings, which led to an in-park tour of the Sliammon First Nations' archaeological sites in Desolation Sound Park and enabled the first steps in the preservation of the Sliammon heritage in this park.

When Georgia recognized that the knowledge she and others had gained about the archaeological sites in Desolation Sound needed to be preserved and shared with others, she developed a digital system to record the location and status of archaeological sites within the park; her system will ensure that the parks cultural resources are protected now and in the future.

Georgia efforts in cultivating relationships with the Sliammon First Nation have led to several important initiatives to advance BC Parks connections with the Sliammon people. Georgia's contributions are not only recognized by her BC Parks and Ministry of Environment colleagues, but also by many other outside the BC Parks agency. Dana Lepofsky, Associate Professor with Simon Fraser University, writes, "It is in large part that because of Georgia that I am embarking on the first steps of a collaborative heritage research program between Simon Fraser University and the Sliammon First Nation... Georgia has a deep respect and understanding of the importance of First Nation heritage."

Georgia is one of those outstanding individuals helping to move BC Parks forward in developing meaningful relationships with First Nations communities. It is in recognition of her dedication, commitment, hard work and successes with the Sliammon First Nation, that Georgia has been awarded the Park Officer of the Year award.

The Park Officer of the Year plaque is on display throughout the year in the Parks and Protected Areas Branch, Headquarters.

We have state-of-the art equipment including a brand new, fully equipped fire truck, a thermal imaging viewer, jaws-of-life, pagers, two-way radios, pumps, ladders, hoses, sirens, and fancy flashing lights. All we need is people to operate everything.

The Northside Fire Protection area consists of all properties from Klahanie Drive to part way up Sarah Point Road. This area, although well equipped, is considered "semi-protected" due to the low number of firefighters and is in danger of being downgraded to "unprotected". If this happens, businesses and homeowners will either not be able to obtain property insurance coverage or will not be able to afford it. Strangely enough, insurance companies are unwilling to provide insurance in "unprotected" areas.

So, first, we need to be able to continue getting insurance coverage. Second, and more importantly, we need to be able to put out fires. Therefore, we need more people.

We meet for practice Monday evenings from 7pm to 9pm. We practice driving the trucks, operating the pumps, talking on the radios, extinguishing fires, first aid, and other duties which we may be required to perform. And it's not a bad deal. We learn a lot. We receive an honourarium. We have social events. And we are there when we are needed.

Starting in September, all members of the fire department will be taking the Certified Volunteer Firefighter Course which can be used as a first step toward becoming a Certified Professional Firefighter, a Paramedic, or other professions. Also offered free are Air Brakes, CPR, First Responder, SeaFire Training, and other related courses as required.

And we are a great group of people - so please join us. I know you don't have the time but none of us do. We work full time, sometimes at two jobs, have families, go shopping, eat, sleep, and show up when we can, as often as we can.
